If the -able ending is added to a word ending in - ce or - ge, the e after the c or g must be kept as those letters would otherwise have their 'hard'sounds (as in cap and gap) before the a of the -able ending.</p> <p>The -able ending is usually but not always used if a complete root word can be heard before it, even if there is no related word ending in -ation.
