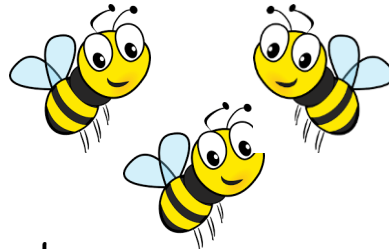
## **LINBY-CUM-PAPPLEWICK PRIMARY SCHOOL BEHAVIOUR GUIDELINES FOR PARENTS & CHILDREN 2021**

**We should all play our part in making our school a special place for everyone by: keeping to all the school rules and safety guidelines; and welcoming newcomers and visitors to the school.**

### **School Rules:**

*We try to keep these rules to help make our school a safe, fair, exciting and fun place to work and play.*

- **Be Safe**
- **Be Caring and Respectful**
- **Be Hardworking**



### **Adults in school help you to remember by:**

- Explaining what is expected
- Noticing and praising good behaviour "catch you doing something good";
- Let your parents know when they can be pleased with your behaviour;
- Reminding you if you forget;
- Being pleased when you try.

### **We will know if we are well behaved because:**

- Our friends and adults in school may tell us;
- We may receive a special "Well done" or "Excellent" clap from everyone;

- We may be given some cubes in the jar, a sticker on a chart or something in our class;
- We may be able to choose a special treat for the whole class;
- We may be able to share our achievement with other teachers and children in "Good Work";
- We may receive a sticker or certificate;
- The Head teacher may ask to see you to congratulate you;
- Our parents may be told of our good behaviour.

**If we forget an adult will do one or more of these things:**

- Ask your parents to help you decide how you are going to replace the school property;
- Remind you of the right way to behave - praise you if you respond;
- Tell you you've done the wrong thing, but give you other chances;
- Move you away from those you may disturb;
- Ask you to sit down somewhere quiet to calm down and reflect upon your actions;
- Ask you to stay with the adult on duty at playtime;
- Discuss the mistake with you and the rest of the class in an effort to help you sort it out e.g. within a circle time or playtime to restore relationships;
- Take away your playtime (or some of it) or other privileges - send you to the entrance hall to give you the chance to think carefully about what you have done and if you wish to complete a 'Thinking Time' sheet;
- Send work home or keep you in at playtimes to complete your work;
- Send you to another classroom to cool off to give the rest of the class some space;
- Send you to the Head teacher;
- Send a letter home to your parent (e.g. for misbehaving on trips, repeatedly not having school uniform, continual poor behaviour, serious incidents);
- Your teacher may request to see your parents and individual targets may be set up;
- Head teacher and class teacher will request to see your parents.

**Very serious misbehaviour includes:**

- Bullying, intimidating or threatening others
- Refusing to co-operate with an adult
- Being violent or hurting others on purpose
- Being racist to others
- Being abusive to others
- Deliberately damaging or taking property that does not belong to you

**If you do any of these:**

You will be sent to the entrance hall to give you the chance to think carefully about what you have done (and if you wish complete a thinking time sheet)

**The adult may do one or more of these things:**

- Ask your parents to help you decide how you are going to replace the school property;
- Discuss the mistake with you and the rest of the class in an effort to help you sort it out e.g. within a circle time or playtime;
- Take away your playtime or other privileges;
- Send you to another classroom to cool off to give the rest of the class some space;
- Send you to the Head teacher;
- Send a letter home to your parent;
- Your teacher may request to see your parents and individual targets may be set up;
- Head teacher and class teacher will request to see your parents;
- You may be sent home from school
