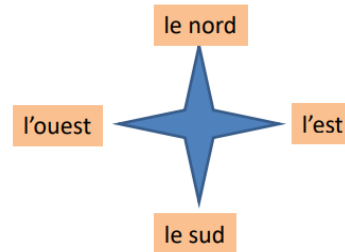

Phonics and pronunciation

E sound in **le** & **de**

EAU sound in **beau**

Silent letters: The 'd' is not pronounced in **chaud**, 's' is not pronounced in **dans** and **mauvais** and the 't' is not pronounced in **fait** & **vent**. These letters are often silent at the end of words.

Elision: As seen in **l'est**. The 'e' has been dropped in **le** as the next word starts with a vowel. This helps pronunciation in French but can make it hard to know where one word starts and finishes.
